

Below is a full list of congressionally-directed spending items secured by Congressman Rothman in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2010:

- Funding for Cops in Schools and Cops on the Street, programs that would add police patrols to reduce crime and improve security of schools in North Arlington, \$100,000.
- Funding to upgrade and convert video cameras in patrol cars to digital technology for Ridgefield Park Police Department, \$85,000.
- Upgrade to the Public Safety Radio Communication System in Bergen County, \$900,000
- Upgrade to the Police and Emergency Services Communication System in Hackensack, \$200,000
- New Lap Top Computers for Police Patrol Vehicles in Leonia, \$33,000
- Returning Offender Initiative, Helping nonviolent offenders successfully reintegrate into the community in Newark, \$400,000
- School Resource Officer Program to provide a police officer at the high school in Garfield, \$100,000
