

Congressman Rothman Meets with Representatives from the National Patient Advocate Foundation

Lyndhurst Resident Makes Trip to Washington, D.C.

(Washington, DC) – On Thursday, June 25, 2009, Congressman Steve Rothman met with representatives of the National Patient Advocate Foundation (NPAF), including constituent Joyce Jacobson of Lyndhurst, a physician’s assistant and State Public Liason to the Patients Congress. Jacobson was joined in the visit to Congressman Rothman’s office by Mary Stabile of Miltown and Kristine Fredricksdorf of Cherry Hill. The group discussed health care reform, including closing the donut hole and fair and equal access to affordable health care. They agreed with Congressman Rothman’s support of a public option.

The National Patient Advocate Foundation is a national non-profit organization providing the patients voice in improving access to, and reimbursement for, high-quality health care through legislative reforms at the state and federal levels. NPAF helps tell the stories of those patients dealing with health care issues to legislators across the country. NPAF held its annual Patients Congress in Washington, DC this week bringing together patient advocates from across the country.
