Jersey City to Build New Public Safety Communications Center

(Jersey City, NJ)— On Monday, November 6, Congressman Steve Rothman (D-NJ) joined Jersey City Mayor Jerramiah Healy and others to break ground on a new Public Safety Communications Center for the city. The facility will house police and fire department communications, as well as support for Emergency Medical Services communications. With first responders all together under one roof, they will be able to better coordinate their efforts to keep residents safe.

This new center was made possible by \$12.4 million in federal funding that Congressman Rothman, Senator Bob Menendez, and former-Senator Jon Corzine secured after September 11, 2001.
