

Kearny

Named after the Commander of New Jersey's forces during the Civil War-Major General Philip Kearny-the town of Kearny is located in Western Hudson County between the banks of the Hackensack and Passaic Rivers. It is home to approximately 40,000 residents who enjoy the vibrant thoroughfare of Kearny Avenue as well as close proximity to Jersey City, Newark and New York City.

The development of Kearny can be traced to the late 19th century, when a number of mills opened by foreign companies, including the Clark Thread Company of Scotland and Marshall Flax Spinning Company of England. From there, a number of steel and other manufacturing businesses help shape Kearny into what it is today.
