(Washington DC)—On June 19, 2008, Congressman Steve Rothman (D-Fair Lawn) presented Secaucus High School student Kevin Williams with the Congressional Gold Medal Award. A high school senior, Kevin has spent over one thousand hours performing valuable community service, both in New Jersey and abroad.

The Congressional Award is a public-private partnership created by Congress to promote and recognize achievement, initiative, and service in America's youth. It is an esteemed recognition bestowed on exemplary young people who complete a minimum of 400 hours of voluntary public service, 200 hours of personal development activities, 200 hours of physical fitness, and four consecutive days and nights of an exploration or expedition.

Kevin Williams "epitomizes everything that this award is seeking to extol; particularly his dedication to his community and commitment to public service," said Rothman in a statement issued for the official Congressional Record.
